Flight Options Owners Donate 10 Fractional Hours to Corporate Angel Network

White Plains, NY (Jan. 12, 2011) -- Flight Options, LLC, a leading provider of fractional shares in business aircraft, donated 10 hours of fractional jet flight time to Corporate Angel Network on behalf of its owners. The company has donated flight time to CAN since 2001.

Corporate Angel arranges free flights to treatment for cancer patients using the empty seats on corporate jets.

“This flight time will be used to fly cancer patients to treatment at centers throughout the country,” said Michael Silvestro, Chief Executive Officer. “Corporate Angel provides a unique and extremely valuable service to those afflicted with cancer and we are proud to be able to help.”

“These donations over the years have made a critical and lasting difference in the lives of many of the patients we serve,” said Peter Fleiss, Corporate Angel Network’s Executive Director. “Flight Options was the first fractional ownership program to join Corporate Angel Network, and we are delighted that they continue to support our effort.”

Since its founding nearly 30 years ago, Corporate Angel has grown to include 530 participating corporations, a team of 50 part-time volunteers and six paid staff who work with patients, physicians, corporate flight departments, and leading treatment centers to coordinate the medical travel needs of cancer patients with the flight activity of participating corporations. CAN has flown more than 36,000 cancer patients to specialized treatment and typically flies between 250 and 300 patients each month.

Flight Options, a leader in the private jet industry offers programs ranging from fractional ownership to aircraft leasing and management as well as a 25-hour pre-paid charter membership card called JetPASS Select. The company provides personalized service to over 1,300 owners and members and own and operate a fleet of more than 100 aircraft.
