**W. W. (Bill) BOISTURE OF HAWKER BEECHCRAFT
NAMED TO CORPORATE ANGEL NETWORK BOARD**

White Plains NY -- W. W. Boisture Jr., Chairman and CEO of Hawker Beechcraft Corporation, has been elected to the board of directors of Corporate Angel Network.

Boisture has more than 30 years of aviation experience. Prior to his current role with Hawker Beechcraft Corporation, he was the President of Intrepid Aviation, a privately held commercial aircraft lessor, and a senior advisor for aerospace at The Carlyle Group.

Boisture, a graduate of the U.S. Air Force Fighter Weapons School and the U.S. Navy Fighter Weapons School, is the former President of NetJets, Gulfstream Aerospace Corporation and British Aerospace Corporate Jets, and the former Chairman and CEO of Butler Aviation.

Corporate Angel, in operation since 1981, arranges free transportation to treatment for cancer patients using empty seats of corporate aircraft. It arranges more than 200 patient flights to treatment every month.

“I have the utmost respect for the life-changing services Corporate Angel Network provides to cancer patients and their families,” Boisture said. “I am pleased to join the board and look forward to assisting in their honorable work.”

Corporate Angel Network is a public charity that arranges free flights for cancer patients to treatment using empty seats on business aircraft. Since its founding in 1981, the charity has grown to include over 500 participating corporations, five paid staff, and a team of 50 part-time volunteers who work with patients, physicians, corporate flight departments, and leading treatment centers to coordinate medical travel needs of cancer patients with the scheduled flight activity of participating corporations. To date, Corporate Angel has arranged more than 33,000 flights and currently provides between 200 and 250 patient flights per month. The organization has received numerous awards in recognition of its service to cancer patients, including The Volunteer Action Award, the highest volunteer award from the President of the United States.
