The award was initiated in 2001 and is co-sponsored by Chevron Global Aviation, Safe Flight Instrument Corporation, and *Business & Commercial Aviation* magazine. The check was presented by Tom Henricks, president of McGraw Hill's AVIATION WEEK magazine, to Peter Fleiss, Executive Director of Corporate Angel Network.

Winners of the Corporate Angel Award so far this year are Goodrich Corporation and CVS/Caremark Corporation along with their aviation departments.

“These companies each contributed tens of thousands of miles to the safe and comfortable transportation for cancer patients traveling to treatment,” Fleiss said. “By traveling in business aircraft, patients avoid crowded and potentially infectious conditions in airports and on commercial flights.”

Corporate Angel Network is a public charity that arranges free flights for cancer patients to treatment using empty seats on business aircraft. Since its founding in 1981, CAN has grown to include over 500 participating corporations, five paid staff, and a team of 50 part-time volunteers who work with patients, physicians, corporate

flight departments, and leading treatment centers to coordinate medical travel needs of cancer patients with the scheduled flight activity of participating corporations. To date, CAN has arranged more than 32,000 flights and currently provides between 200 and 250 patient flights per month. CAN has received numerous awards in recognition of its service to cancer patients, including The Volunteer Action Award, the highest volunteer award from the President of the United States.
