Safe Flight Donates \$50,000 To Corporate Angel Network

White Plains, NY, September 4, 2009—Safe Flight Instrument Corporation, a pioneer in aviation safety and flight performance systems, has contributed \$50,000 to support the work of Corporate Angel Network, the public charity that coordinates free flights to treatment for cancer patients using the empty seats of business aircraft.

On December 22, 1981, the late Leonard Greene, co-founder of CAN and founder of Safe Flight, personally flew the first Corporate Angel Network flight, bringing a sixteen year old boy home to Detroit for Christmas after having received treatment in New York City.
